
# **Bolton, Bury, & Rochdale Breast Screening Service**

#### **Breast screening**

Breast screening is offered to women aged between 50 to 71 years of age, every 3 years. Ladies over the age of 71 will not be sent an appointment automatically, however they can self-refer if they haven't been for a mammogram for 3 years or more by contacting our office on:

#### What is a mammogram?

A mammogram is a breast x-ray. During your appointment, you will be asked to undress to the waist and stand in front of the mammogram machine. Your breasts will be placed one at a time on the x-ray machine. The breast will be pressed down firmly on the surface by a clear plate. At least two pictures of each breast will be taken, one from top to bottom and then a second from side to side to include the part of your breast that extends into your armpit. You will need to stay in this position while the x-ray is taken. You may find it uncomfortable but it only takes a few seconds and the compression doesn't harm the breasts.

Some people worry about the amount of radiation used in mammograms. However, they only deliver a very low dose of radiation (you'd receive a similar amount from flying from London to Australia and back).

# Breast screening service welcomes new diagnostic equipment!

We have received **FOUR** new mammography units to help provide the women of Bolton, Bury and Rochdale with a more efficient and accurate screening service.

The importance of regular breast screening was highlighted during October's breast cancer awareness month. According to www.nhs.uk, approximately 1 in 8 women are diagnosed with breast cancer in their lifetime, however, if detected early, there is a much better chance of recovery.

The new mammography units, (machines that provide x-rays that are used to check for breast cancer or abnormalities in the breast tissue) were provided to the Breast screening service via government funding aimed to help replace ageing diagnostic equipment. The new state of the art mammography units will support the local screening service as well as support all of the Breast service's symptomatic referrals to Bolton hospital.

Jane Brooks, Lead Radiographer, Breast imaging at the Bolton breast unit said, "We understand that breast screening can sometimes be a daunting experience so when women come in to access our services, we want them to be as comfortable as possible. The new equipment is ergonomically designed to make the process more comfortable for both our patients and our



staff. They provide excellent quality images for the diagnosis of breast cancer, which helps us to deliver the best service possible for the community."






# Be breast aware


It's important to check your breasts regularly and see your GP if you notice a change.


Please check your breasts **every month**. Look out for a lump or thickening in the breast, a change in the nipple, a rash that makes the nipple look red and scaly, or blood or another fluid coming from the nipple, a change in how the breast feels or looks such as feeling heavy, warm or uneven, or the skin may look dimpled, the size and shape of the breast may change, pain or discomfort in the breast or armpit, a swelling or lump in the armpit. If you notice any changes in between mammograms, you should make an appointment to see your GP straight away.



Men can also get breast cancer.

Most men don't realise that they need to be chest aware but it is important for everyone to check themselves regularly. If you have any of the following symptoms, please speak to your GP; a painless lump, inverted or retracted nipple, oozing, bleeding from the nipple, a rash in the nipple area, skin ulcer on the chest, a lump or swelling in the armpit or changes in the

size and shape of the chest.

If you change address, please make sure you inform your GP surgery or your breast screening letter will go to your old address – you don't want to miss your 3 yearly mammogram.


